Statement on Bullying

What is Bullying?

We identify when any of the following happens repeatedly to the same person causing them to become unhappy or frightened.

- Name calling
- Teasing
- Spreading nasty stories about the person
- Leaving the person out of groups
- Threatening and frightening the person
- Taking or interfering with the persons belongings
- Hitting and kicking
- Cyber-bullying

Preventing Bullying

- We can all help
- Remember everyone is as important in our school as everyone else
- We should talk to someone if we are bullied or bullying someone
- We should always play where adults are supervising
- We should never take the bully's side against others
- We should support children in our class

What if Bullying Happens?

Type of Bullying

Action to be Taken

Isolated Incidents

Name-calling
Teasing

Apology
Incident dealt with by Classteacher or Midday
Supervisor

Repeated Incidents

Name-calling
Teasing
Spreading Stories
Leaving out of groups
Threatening/frightening behaviour
Gang involvement

All to be reported to Headteacher/SMT
Possible exclusion for any repeated
incident – all exclusions reported to Chair
Parents informed
Use of circle time/assemblies

Physical Incidents

Hitting or kicking which causes
severe injury/distress
Organised gang intimidation

All to be reported to Headteacher/SMT
Possible exclusion for any physical incident -
all exclusions reported to Chair
Parents informed

Racist Incidents

Name-calling

All to be reported to Headteacher/SMT
Headteacher to make report to LA
