Community Defibrillator Seminar

8/15 pm. Thursday 19th November 2015

The Community Heartbeat Trust will be demonstrating the use of defibrillators and explaining how the equipment works and its benefits to the community in saving precious minutes in the treatment of sudden cardiac arrest.

The Old School, Church Street, Crick.

The more people that know how to use the portable defibrillator installed in our community, the more chance there is of saving the life of a victim of Sudden Cardiac Arrest

Everybody is welcome, and no special skills are required, just your willingness to play an important role in the event of a medical emergency

Case History

"I died.....and was saved!"

June 24th 2013 will be a day Philip Dunkley will remember. It was the day he almost died of a Cardiac Arrest.

Philip was visiting his golf club for a match, and was approaching the 16th green. It ran along side the 17th fairway, separated by a small bank. He hit his shot and it skewed to the right, over the bank to the 17th fairway. His teammates continued with their shots to the 16th, when out of concern, they realised Philip was not with them. He had taken his battery operated cart up the bank to the 17th, and had not returned. Philip was found lying in the long grass, unconscious.

His colleague, Alan, had recently undertaken a CPR course as part of his work, and he immediately started CPR whilst the green keeper rang 999 and went for help. The manager of the golf club knew there was a public access defibrillator in the village and went to get this, bringing it back to the unconscious Philip. The defibrillator was applied and gave 2 shocks whilst CPR continued. Shortly afterwards the paramedics and air ambulance arrived to take Philip to Coventry Hospital, where after 2 days in intensive care, he made a full recovery.

The community defibrillator had been placed into the village the previous November in memory of Claire Squires from North Kilworth who died on the London Marathon. This was the first time it had been used in earnest. Working with the Community Heartbeat Trust, members of the village positioned the defibrillator at the petrol station on the main road in the village, for easy access.

"You can be prepared for many things in life" said Jackie, Philip's wife. "The fact someone was there to do CPR and then fetch the defibrillator – well it's just fantastic! Philip is here as a testament to the fast action of his friends."



The Community Heartbeat Trust is at the forefront of supporting rural communities with Public Access Defibrillators, in co-operation with the UK ambulance services. To date, CHT has been involved in over 750 locations.
