<u>Daintree Wind Farm Community</u> Fund Grant

The school wish to thank the Daintree Wind Farm Community Fund for their generous grant of £4000 in order to replace old inefficient lighting with new LED lighting. Lighting has been replaced in a substantial area of the school which will improve working conditions for pupils, staff and external users. It will also result in reduced energy cost.

The local authority is no longer responsible for the upkeep of the fabric of the school and a very small amount of capital money is allocated for this on an annual basis. Grants such as these provide schools with much needed funds to enable us to maintain and improve the school environment.

Dear Sir / Madam,

Public Spaces Protection Order – Enhanced Dog Control Powers Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014

Following a consultation with residents, Daventry District Council will be introducing enhanced dog control measures from 1st December 2015. These powers form part of a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) made under the Anti-social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014.

The new powers, which replace and add to existing powers will make it an offence to:

- fail to pick up after your dog. This will now include all land to which the public can gain access
- fail to put your dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer this allows
 Council Officers to direct that a dog is put on a lead when it is causing nuisance and/or danger
 to other persons and their dogs
- fail to prevent your dog from entering a designated children's play area
- fail to put your dog on a lead in the designated dogs on leads area around the Visitor Centre/Café in Daventry Country Park
- fail to provide at the request of an authorised officer the means by which you intend to pick up after your dog

Any breach of the Order could result in the offender being issued with a £100 fixed penalty notice or being taken to court where they could receive a fine on conviction of up to £1000. There will be an initial three month period of education during which officers will provide advice and issue verbal warnings as necessary. Formal enforcement of the Order will start from 1st April 2016.
